Sisters and Brothers,

In this communication I would like to talk with you on a few very important things that we will be concentrating on between now and the first half of next year.

As you are well aware our contract will expire July of 2022, so in preparations for this we will be doing several things that we will be asking you for some help and input on, as well as asking you to contribute to.

- (a) Sometime in November or December the Union Hall will be handing out a Contract Survey that we would ask each and every one of you to take some time to fill out honestly and with real thought as to how you would like our issues and concerns to be prioritized in the upcoming set of negotiations.
- (b) We will be starting a Contract Action Team or Communications Action Team that will help the Bargaining Committee's exchange of information as negotiations are going on, i.e. handbill info, communicate shirt days and button days along with solidarity marches in or out of the plant. If you are interested, we would like to have a list of volunteers from all shifts and all departments of the plant.
- (c) We will be holding Steward School training sometime in November that anyone who is off shift can come to and share in the exchange of union history and how we conduct our business, so if you are a new steward or would just like to participate in this event, please stop by or call the Union Hall and sign up so we have a good idea of how many people to expect. Educating and empowering the membership is vital to our way of life.

I would also like to take this time and let you all know some updates we have on several of your committees.

Safety Committee

Two newly-appointed shift safety representatives will be participating in an OSHA 30-hour course. Vincent Moody is our Shift-2 Safety rep from Dept 178, and Michael Moranville Shift-1 Dept 412.

We have recently canceled a safety training event with the National Safety Council due to Covid reasons, mainly travel related.

Dennis Green, Adam Cornish and Michael Moranville continue working with the new hires on forklift safety.

Perform your safety machine checks and report any issues to management. It is the company's responsibility to provide a safe workplace and equipment.

Also, just a reminder to everyone, Lock Out/ Tag Out remains a big issue for all of us across the plant and in all departments. If you have any doubts or concerns, get ahold of your supervisor and shift safety rep so that you are not putting yourself at risk, both from harm or discipline.
